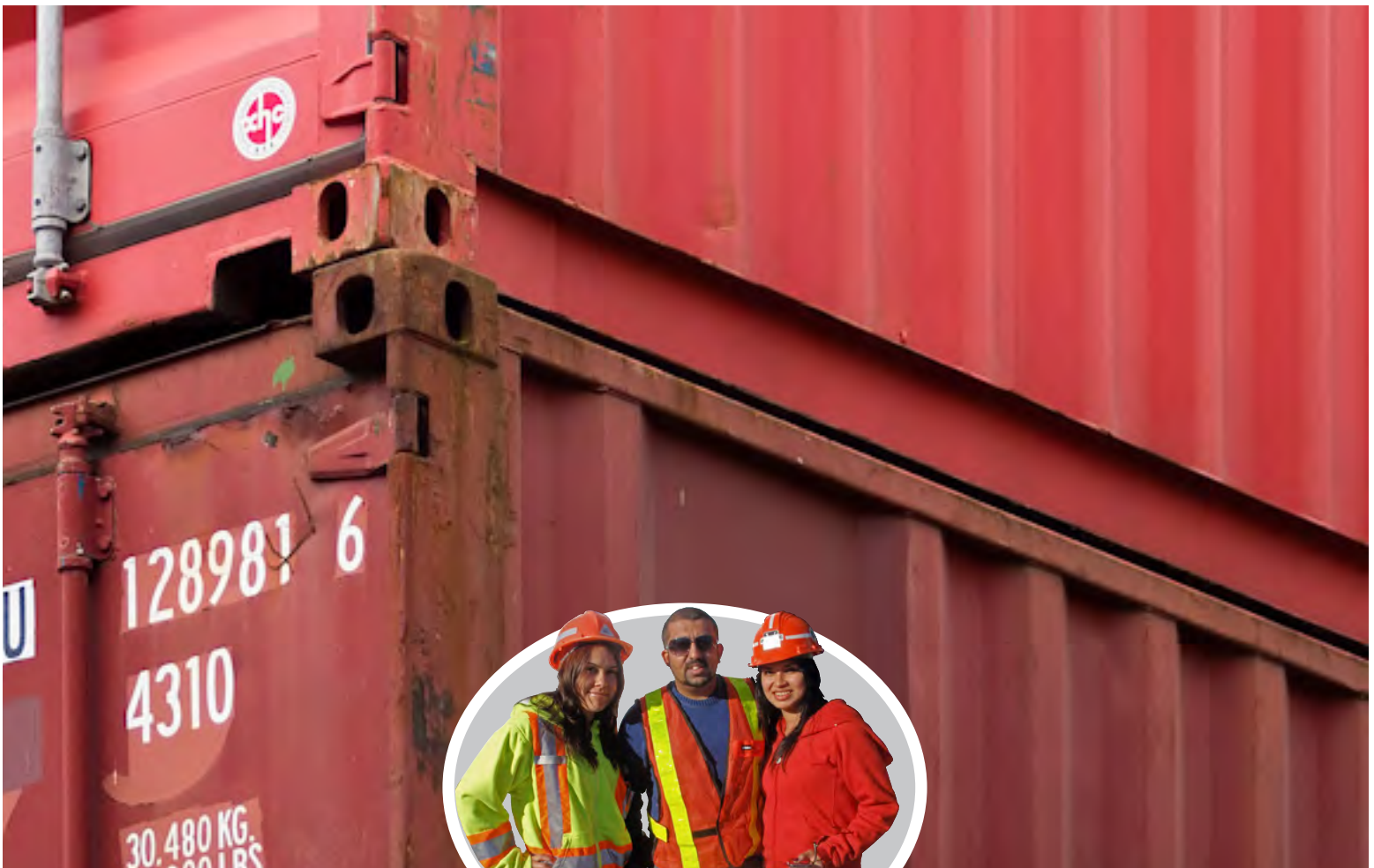

# 4 NEW COURSES



## MOVEMENT OF GOODS & INTERMODAL TRANSPORTATION

Course duration: 14 hours (2 days full time)

Learn the fundamental importance of intermodal transportation efficiency in controlling logistics costs. The need and nature of and benefits resulting from international supply chain. Explain the importance of transport as a main component of logistics and define and explain a producer's production, marketing and distribution costs, and show how they can be calculated.

At the end of the course the candidate will have a clear understanding of supply chain, logistics and the effect of distribution costs on the final price of a product.

## THE CONTAINER FREIGHT BOX

Course duration: 8 hours (2 days part time)

Learn the nature, design and basic structure of a general purpose marine freight container. Name the materials from which containers are constructed, explain their advantages, disadvantages and main uses, and indicate how they can be recognized. Explain the dimensional and operational specifications of standard containers. Explain how containers are tested, approved and certificated. Describe the range of container types based on ISO standards. Describe the ISO system of container marks and the reasons for its development and use. To describe the range of other marks and labels commonly displayed on a container.

The candidate will acquire the ability to 'read' the ISO and other container marks and understand their meanings.



## WAREHOUSE CONTAINER PLANNING PROCESS

Course duration: 8 hours (2 days part time)

Learn to describe and explain how poor container packing practices and procedures can cause damage, deterioration and other problems to products, and to discuss responsibility and liability for accidents resulting from poor packing. Explain the preliminary documentary and other procedures preparatory to a container being packed with cargo and describe the principles, techniques and practices followed when planning for the packing of products in containers.

The candidates will learn how appropriate containers are selected for the cargo consignments booked for packing by shippers, as well as the main features of the container loading plan, and the steps involved in preparing it.



## ADVANCED WAREHOUSE CONTAINER PLANNING PROCESS

Course duration: 8 hours (2 days part time)

Learn to explain how a container is inspected and prepared in readiness for being packed with products. To describe the general principles and working practices followed when packing and securing goods in containers. Explain how particular types of regular and special packages and cargoes are packed into containers describe the tallying, recording and other documentary procedures followed during and after packing a container. To outline the precautionary, procedural and documentary steps followed when unpacking a freight container.

The candidate will learn to plan and pack special, awkward and out of gauge products into a container in a higher level. The prerequisite for this course is "Warehouse container packing practice".





## THE VANCOUVER ABORIGINAL SKILLS AND EMPLOYMENT PARTNERSHIP (VANASEP)

Since 2005 over 2000 clients have participated in the VanAsep Construction Careers program and over 1000 Aboriginal people are currently registered as trades apprentices. We began as the training authority to support Aboriginal employment in the lead up to the 2010 Winter Olympics. The partnership was recognized with an Award of Excellence in Education from the Vancouver Regional Construction Association and provincial designation as an ITA (Industry Training Authority of B.C.) certified trainer.

In 2009 VanAsep began expanding its training model to bring a greater wealth of opportunity to First Nation communities throughout BC. Setting up key partnerships is essential to VanAsep, and we work with local industries identifying and facilitating employment and economic development opportunities for First Nations and Aboriginal people.
